- V The Bakerie at Shalimar** Though advertised as a place to pick up a snack on the go, The Bakerie offers, apart from tarts, croissants, and pastries, over 20 kinds of gateaux and fancy and shape cakes, including the orange nougat and “Barbie Doll”.
- M Baskin Robbins** Possibly the chain’s smallest parlour, it delivers from Haji Ali to Kemps Corner.
- U Birdy’s** If you miss Croissants Etc.’s Dutch truffle or chocolate truffle pastries, Birdy’s, which is a brand of the same parent company, is your next best option.
- O Brijwasi** Pure ghee, milk, mawa, dry fruit and Bengali mithais pile the shelves in this dingy shop where the bestsellers include the kaju pak, kaju katli, badam katli and malai cake.
- B Celebrations** We’re big fans of Celebrations’ lemon and orange dots (muffins with a creamy citrus filling), orange-apricot cake, liqueur chocolates and tarts.
- S A Chocolate Affair** Ignore the chocolate- and chilli-dusted potato fries, and veer instead towards the more standard fare, such as waffles, brownies, sundaes and fondue.
- E Chocolateria San Churro** A dessert shop that chose Breach Candy after Bandra, this outpost is much larger, with seating for almost 60 people. In addition to churros, the menu features hot chocolate, coffee, shakes and sandwiches.
- A Cinnabon** Various sizes of warm cinnamon rolls, which you can smell before you walk into the shop, are topped with cream cheese icing, pecans and caramel. They also sell creamy sugarbomb smoothies, called Chillattas, but if you have to pick just one thing, you can’t go wrong with the classic cinnamon roll.
- J The Cocoa Trees** While most of this shop’s offerings are brands that you find in supermarkets – Bounty, After Eight, Toblerone – The Cocoa Trees also offers a few harder-to-find ones like GoldKenn and Duc d’O.
- N Delifresh**, located inside the always-empty Tulips restaurant, is the place for old-fashioned cakes that remind you of kiddie birthday parties in the 1980s and early ’90s. Pineapple cake, Black Forest and apple pie share space with chocolate-dipped strawberries, hazelnut pastries and oatmeal cookies.
- Q Fantasie Chocolates** A chocolate shop that offers “33 varieties of 100 per cent veg chocolates”, Fantasie sells such home-grown flavours as spiced chai and Bournvita. Their fish-shaped chocolates are a hit with kids.
- F Food Shop** You get Gujju-palate-pleasing plum cakes, chocolate walnut cakes, milk cakes and brownies here. The biggest draw, however, is a refrigerator case full of Anando’s masala milk.
- I Mad Over Donuts** Among the many diet-breaking, egg-less doughnuts this chain offers, the glazed, cinnamon and chocolate varieties are the biggest hits.
- R MT Madon & Co.** The chemist’s daughter came up with the idea of making “chocolate paan” – massive heart-shaped milk chocolates stuffed with gulkand and paan masala.
- P Muchhad Paanwala** The mustachioed paanwala’s sweetest paan is not the meetha paan, but what the owners call a “ladies’ paan”. A meetha paan is topped with sweetened coconut, and chutney (sweet syrup with bits of silver foil) in flavours such as chocolate, and raat ki rani (also known as night-blooming jasmine). On this goes a heap of strawberry or chocolate “powder”.
- L Om Cold Sweet Pan** They have been serving their chilled, tightly wrapped khus- and coconut-stuffed paan for over three decades. You can also buy a paan gola: a laddu-shaped, foil-wrapped, frozen paan mash sweet enough to qualify as a mithai.
- K Punjab Sind Paneer Centre** It’s not just good for paneer. At this street stall, you also get tubs of sweet lassi, shrikhand, mawa, basundi and rabdi.
- D Ramanlal Vithaldas & Co. Mewawala** A mithai purveyor whose badam pak is second to none.
- G The Right Place** Snowman’s was the original reason people came to Breach Candy for dessert; The Right Place has taken off from where that soft-serve shop left. In addition to “softies”, The Right Place sells ice-cream cakes and a three-scoop sundae called Gilly Gilly.
- T 6th Street Yogurt** The name of the city’s newest frozen yoghurt store is a nod to Austin, Texas, where the Sixth Street District is dotted with fro-yo parlours. In addition to yoghurt in vanilla, chocolate, strawberry and raspberry flavours, with toppings such as fresh fruit and chocolate cigars, 6th Street serves waffles, parfaits and smoothies.
- H Toujours** Macarons, gateaux, verrines, tarts, tea cakes, and chocolates – those are just half the sweet offerings on the menu of this French patisserie. The goods are beautifully decorated, the regular and egg-less sections clearly divided, and the well-spoken staff always helpful. We recommend the red velvet cupcake.
- C Yogurtbay** Frozen yoghurt in both fat-free and regular varieties; fruit, nut and chocolate toppings; and the promise of no artificial flavours or colours. Yogurtbay, which opened its second outlet here after launching in Bandra, positions itself as a healthier dessert alternative.
